A Maunder Winter?

Within the last week or two there have been articles in the main stream of the magnetic reversal of sunspots which indicates the end of the solar peak. It is predicted these changes will happen within the next 4-6 months. This will be a slow process, you will not a wake up one morning to find all the sunspots will have changed polarity.

Recently at the Pacific Northwest DX Convention, hosted by the Spokane DX Club, Randy Crews, W7TJ spoke on "Preparing for the Propagation Winter". It was an eye opening experience for many attendees, myself included. If the predictions come true, I and many others have worked our last good Sun Spot Cycle Peak.

While Sun Spot Cycle predictions are a little like weather forecasting, information is much better today than ten years ago. There is a lack of records on cycles which make long term predictions difficult. "Do a search on maunder minimum global cooling", look at the chart on http://www.globalresearch.ca/nasa-we-may-be-on-the-verge-of-a-mini-maunder-event-is-a-planetary-cooling-spell-straight-ahead/5318725. Notice the Maunder minimum period of 1650-1700, not good!

There are cycles within sunspots cycles other than the 11-year cycle which are debated and because of a lack of data before 1600 are unknown.

Will there be a Maunder period? Possibly, remember the charts that appeared in most Ham radio magazines showing predictions from the low end to the high end (over 200) for cycle 24 (just broke 100). Guess we will have to wait and see.
