Radio doesn't Work **Bruce Reiter**

After passing the Extra exam, my next radio challenge was to learn to operate in HF. Kathleen, N1ERT and I had always



been two-meter users because of its application in emergency response. Moving to the Olympic Peninsula has taught us the importance of HF for maintaining communications in geographically challenged and isolated areas. That and as a reward for passing the Extra Amateur Class exam saw me buy a Yaesu FT 857-D and ATAS 120A antenna at SEA-PAC.

I had the system installed in Portland and used the manual to setup the antenna and radio. I turned to one of the urban repeaters and could hear their signal but was unable to get my signal to the repeater or to a friend's hanheld. No problem. I obviously hadn't set something right.

Back on the Peninsula, I began to troubleshoot the problem. I wasn't getting the proper symbols when I fired up the radio. I tuned in the Club's Striped Peak repeater, set the shift and the tone. I could hear it but the repeater couldn't hear me. I consulted Dennis, AD7TV who has the same radio. He sent me a good tutorial for operation. No luck.

I communicated with Yaesu and one of their techs guided me through troubleshooting. After several contacts, he requested I send the radio back. The final straw occurred during the 5th Saturday Radio Exercise when Al, W7YLV pronounced the radio "dead" with "No RF energy".

Now the radio is in the hands of UPS and Yaesu. As an operator I need to learn more of the technical side of amateur radio and to understand that the display symbols tell a story not to be ignored.
