## The answer to last month's Mind Bender

You have the 9" diameter by 4" thick chocolate cake in front of you on the counter -- remember ??

Your task was to cut it into *eight equal sized/shaped pieces* -- with only three swipes of the 10" knife -- remember ???

Well -- position the cake so you are looking **straight** down on top of it and make one cut down through the cake -- making sure that you cut through the exact center of the cake -- now turn the cake 90 degrees (left or right) and make a second cut straight down -- making sure again to hit the exact center of the cake. You now have *four* equally sized/shaped pieces. Now position the cake so that you are looking at the **edge/side** of it -- and -- *half way up from the bottom* -- make a cut all the way through the cake (the cut is parallel with the plate that the cake is resting on) -- **VOILA !!!** -- you have eight equal sized/shaped pieces of cholate cake with only three swipes of the knife.

We use lots of that at work at JPL. there's several kinds, some with conductive adhesive, some with a sort of cross hatch pattern.

You can use it around waveguide flange joints, or for covering a seam in a shielding box. You can wrap it around a multiconductor cable as a "expedient shield" (e.g. around power and control lines that are radiating). Heck, I've built little shielded boxes with copper foil tape around a PCB.

It also makes a nice gasket material which is soft and conductive, so when you torque the fasteners, it makes good contact.

The only real issue is that it's also a remarkably effective knife, especially after you've peeled the adhesive backing.

You can get it as 3M part 1181, comes in lots of widths

To keep this moderately antenna related, I've used it to make a helical antenna (spiraled on a plastic pipe form) and to make a dipole and a Yagi (on paper, and you could roll it up when done)."

Editors Note: Make a vertical three element beam for 2m or 440 on the back of a closet door. Opening the door and using it as a pivot to am the antenna can improve your signal. So when you're told your fading the and to try a different spot, this could be a solution. This also solves the problem of no outdoor antenna.
