## Club Two Way Email List by Groups.io

Groups.io

A number of years ago a Yahoo group separate from the CCARCQTC (Email account) was started that allowed free exchange of emails between members. There were 41 members of that group, however, not all were club members and some had not paid the club dues. That Yahoo group is now shifting to groups.io with the name of CCARCWA. The shift was prompted due to sometimes extended delays between sending messages and others receiving messages.

Groups.io has a number of features not found in the Yahoo Groups. Along with email, photos and files, groups.io has databases, a WIKI, chat and the ability to have subgroups.

A couple of things came to mind when I saw the database capability. Club assets such as transceivers could be inventoried for all members to see. The cargo trailer has lots of stuff in it that could be inventoried in a database so it would be instantly available. I started a couple of databases just as an example.

The WIKI seems like a great place for training information. The club tower training came to mind. Also thing like PSKReporter and WSJT training information could be entered.

The CCARCWA groups.io is a work in progress that could use input from all club members. The link to subscribe to the group is <u>W7FEL+subscribe@CCARCWA.groups.io</u> . Subscription to the CCARCWA does not, however, get you an automatic subscription to groups.io. To register for groups.io use <u>https://groups.io/register</u> . I encourage you to register with groups.io as you must be registered with groups.io in order to view the web based files, photos, databases and WIKI.

Please join the group. Most areas are open for member editing or input. You may start a new database or WIKI, download a file or photos.

At the May (and June) Club meeting will be sign-up sheets for Field Day and Firework sales.

Field Day is a great opportunity to try out HF, even if you are only a Technician Class operator. We run under the club call sign, W7FEL, and we have an Extra on site at all times. Please don't be shy, come on out and give it a try. Invite friends and family to come and "Get On The Air" in the GOTA tent. If you have never tried HF, this is your opportunity (or have been off of HF for over a year).

For those new to Ham Radio or new to the club, Field Day is an annual event put on by the ARRL. It accomplishes 3 things. First, it lets us set up radio gear in an "off grid" environment to let us test an emergency situation. Our club runs primarily on a generator. Last year one club member ran a radio setup on solar.

Second, from 11am Saturday to 11am Sunday, it is a contest. We try to get as many contacts with other Field Day sites as possible in addition to as many stations around the world.

Lastly it is an important social time! As a club we get to mingle with other members and show off to the public our hobby. There are planned meals, a GOTA (Get on the Air) radio for non-hams or inactive hams to try out a radio. There will be opportunities to see how the digital modes work.

There are many areas that anyone can help with.

Starting at 0900 on Friday, we set up the tower, tents, radios, generator, and so on. Many hands make light work.

Saturday we need people to be guides from 12-5 to show guests around and tell them about Ham Radio. Most importantly, we need radio operators! Especially if you do not have an HF setup at home, we need you to just show up and make contacts. This is a "Contact Sport" after all! If you plan on operating with us, please sign up with your desired time, band and mode.

Sunday we load out. Just as important as setup, we need to take it all down and properly pack it all up for next time.

#### CCARC Field Day Committee Meeting Thursday, April 19th 2018 Sequim IHOP

The committee discussed antenna selection and locations, band usage, tent and generator locations, trailer towing assignments, radio allocations, grounding and fire safety.

Several members then visited the field day site at the Clallam County Fairgrounds. The preliminary site configuration will be – TBD

- Note that there will be two towers, supporting three antennas.
- Specific radios have not been assigned yet, but see the note below for a recommendation on standardization.
- The 40m tent will probably be designated CW and digital on an alternating time schedule.
- The GOTA tent will be 80m phone, perhaps with a 2m call-in rig.
- 10/15/20m tents will be phone and digital.
- Each tent will have a GFI outlet with ground stake, as well as a fire extinguisher.
- We need several more ground stakes
- Each generator will have a fire extinguisher.
- We will make-up coax cables on-site using the 400ft spool of RG-213 and connectors.
- We will need 40m and 80m band-pass filters for those antennas to prevent cross-coupling.

Our Field Day category will change from 3A to 4A with the addition of the 40m tent.

- Sheldon will have food sign-up sheets at the May and June meetings.
- Bill P reports that we have 4 PC's available for logging. The GOTA tent may not get one.
- Trailer towing assignments-

Al Fisk will tow his trailer to the site.

Mark E will have a tower crew and tow vehicle for his trailer.

Radio Standardization and Modernization

We currently have the following ICOM radios available for field day use-

- IC-706: HF, 6m 2m, 70cm / 100 watts / DC power
- IC-746: HF, 6m, 2m / 100w / DC
- IC-745: HF / 100w / DC
- IC-735: HF / 100w / DC
- IC-718: HF / 100w / DC

The IC-706 has a phase-locked-loop noise generation issue common to all 706 units. This makes it unsuitable for use in a multi-radio environment like field day. After much discussion, the committee decided to recommend to the CCARC board that the 706 be sold with the income going into the club treasury. To replace the 706, and to begin the process of updating and standardizing on a single radio model, the committee recommends the immediate purchase of at least one IC-7300; new or used at the board's discretion. The committee suggests that the club continue to purchase 7300's as the budget allows until we have replaced all five older radios.

As part of this discussion the issue of allowing members to bring their own radios was brought up. There does not appear to be any restriction on changing radios during field day, other than only one radio per band/mode transmitting at once. The consensus of the committee is that using someone else's radio is a bad idea, and swapping the club radios in and out will only cause problems. Therefore the committee discourages the use of personal radios.

The next committee meeting is set for Thursday, May 17th, 11:30 at IHOP again.
