For anyone who is looking for someone to repair an older model ICOM radio that is no longer supported by ICOM for repairs and parts, I found a former ICOM repair guy that was willing to fix my ICOM 2800, which is about 18 years old. His name is Scott Malcom, and he works in Toledo, Wa. My ICOM 2800 display didn't work. I contacted Scott via email. He was able to fix it for just under \$90. His email address is <u>mts@toledotel.com</u>. He was quick to reply to emails, and the turn around time was about 3 weeks. I have installed the radio in my car and it works great. This is the first ICOM radio I have used, and I was pretty excited to make contacts from Carlsborg, Wa., to Port Townsend, Lyman, and Mt Baker, on LOW power, which is 5 watts on this radio. My antenna is a home-made magnet mount antenna pieced together from stuff on my shelf, and I cut the antenna at 19 inches for the 2 meter band.

I am very pleased with the results, and recommend him to anyone looking to get an older ICOM radio working again.

CQ World Wide DX Contest

Chuck Jones, Jeannine, guest Ryu KI6FE, and I participated in a DX contest the weekend of October 26-28.

This contest was SSB Phone 10-160 meters. We were mostly were on 15, 20, and 40 meters.

This contest was different than the Salmon Run we participated in last month. We did manage to contact 54 zones, 270 QSO's, worked 125 countries, and made 132,997 points. Worked a total of 19.25 hours. Jeannine worked zone 40, Iceland, hard to get! I got China and the Philippines.

Lessons learned: Station equipment including several good antennas makes all the difference.

- \Rightarrow The QSO's were short and to the point, no extra talking.
- \Rightarrow Accents were not a problem for the majority of the contacts.
- \Rightarrow Propagation was pretty good. Some static from storms.
- \Rightarrow Knowing where the daylight was made all the difference.
- ⇒ Pile-ups were common, but if you waited a while then you could work them.
- \Rightarrow Learning how to adjust the radio and amplifier is an art.
- \Rightarrow Don't adjust equipment you are not familiar with.
- \Rightarrow When you change operators remember to change call signs!!
- \Rightarrow Work strong signals first, then weaker.
- \Rightarrow Work greater points then lesser.
- ⇒ Turning antenna in the right direction makes contacts easier to hear and work.
- \Rightarrow Watch band plans.
- \Rightarrow Sometimes a YL's voice gets the contact thru the pileups.
- \Rightarrow We are here to learn and have fun.

We need more people to come and learn about contesting, and have fun. Please come and see for yourself.

YL Luncheon Friday 11:30. Paradise in Sequim.

Presentation called "Bathtub, Slinkies, and Mirrors By Bill P.

Using common props to explain wave physics. How waves travel in different mediums. Used spring demo-wave bounces backs, we use surge protectors to save equipment. Standing wave, resonance builds up waves. Waves in a spring, example of resonant waves, instruments, air in flux. Light in a laser. Used video of Tacoma Narrows to demo standing waves, bridge fell down. Mismatches cause reflection, transmission line losses, ex. kinks in spring. Used tubing to demo action.

Antennas, use tuner in shack, or at antenna feed point. Ladder line causes little loss. Open and Short revisited- short reflects in opposite direction, open reflects in same direction. Discussion on quarter waves and stub filter. This presentation will be found on the CCARC web site for further information.

DID YOU KNOW?

Looking at amateur radio forums and email threads, oftentimes amateur radio operators will use "73" or "73s" where one might otherwise expect to find "Sincerely" or "Regards". Why?

The usage of "73" for such a purpose comes from the <u>Phillips Code</u>, originally devised in the era of telegraphs to speed up transmission of common messages by mapping them to numbers.

"73" mapped to "best regards" or "my compliments" and was intended as a general <u>valediction</u> for transmitted messages.

It is still used for that purpose today in Morse code transmissions and often makes its way into everyday correspondence among hams as a form of jargon.

There is also "88" (which maps to "love and kisses") that sometimes takes the place of "73" for communications between affectionate parties.

From the Phillips Code: Making any of these numbers plural (73s, 88s, etc.) is incorrect since they are already plural. 73s would mean best regardses and 88s would mean love and kisseses. Those make no sense. http://www.signalharbor.com/73.html
