President's Corner

April, a quarter of the way thru 2021. How does that happened so quickly.

As a radio club we do not have much to offer the community, or our members, should we be asked to help support some unknown emergency. Our five radios are stored one place, along with one power supply. Antennas, if there are any usable antennas, are in the cargo trailer at another location.

Here is a thought to ponder for a moment and be prepared to express your thoughts at the club meeting on May 12th. The Club's five old radios are used exclusively for field day. An Icom 735, an Icom 746, and Icom 718, and an Icom 706 and an Icom 745 built into Go Boxes. None of the radios are alike; we don't train members how to operate them and each field day (FD) it is an experience for each operator to come up to speed and knowledgeably operate any one of these radios. None of the equipment is readily available should an emergency arise and the Club was called on to lend a hand.

So here is a what if,,,, and keep in mind the Club has approximately \$17,000 in the bank..... what if the Club purchases new radios for three "radios in a box" (RIBs) that could be stored at individuals homes ready for immediate use, as well as field day. The Club could provide member training on the radios so radio set up and options would be a familiar item at field day or during an emergency. At FD members would be more likely to operate a radio they were familiar and knowledgable with. Since the RIBs will be easy to set up the Club could sponsor mini FDs at a park or someones home. The RIBs would also be available for immediate deployment should they be needed

and members could take the RIBs on loan, after a full indoctrination, for a period of time to become even more comfortable with their operation.

If the "general idea" has membership support, the Board suggests a small committee gather information on what actual equipment might be desired along with a projected cost to "complete" one RIB. By complete I am thinking radio(s), signal link, grid power supply, power pole devices, a compact deployable antenna(s), a solar generator, flexible solar panels along with any other ancillary devices that may be required.

Once the design and projected costs are complete the committee would make a presentation to the membership. The membership could then discuss the project and decided IF the Club should to move forward with one or more RIBs.




