President's Corner

Good Day,

The club picnic at Sheldon's home was attended by 13 of 90 some members. I think Covid still has people close to home. The food, according to a number of people that attended was served in the typical Sheldon fashion of greatness.

The property insurance required by the DNR is still being worked on by the board. The Chairman of The Board, Jeramey, recommends Callis, a local insurance company, over the ARRL. The ARRL insurance carrier has given us the run around while Callis has been very helpful, and they are local. In either case the insurance amount will be in the area of \$500.00 annually. Callis will cover ALL club equipment including the trailer and take our Excel equipment spreadsheet as the item input. The ARRL will not cover the trailer and it is necessary for us to input each item in the inventory seperately.

This additional dollar amount for insurance added to the current budget of \$2200 brings the projected budget to \$2700.

So the question is this..... We have about 70 paying club members. There are 92 members, but several are life members and some are members of a family unit. Neither of which pay dues. The dues are \$20 annually. You probably have the picture already. Seventy times \$20 is only \$1,400.00. The question then is how to make up the deficit. Do you raise the dues, slash the budget or annually dig into the savings.

The club currently maintains two repeater sites with a possibility of Ellis Lookout coming along in the next year or so. Repeater site build outs or equipment replacement is not cheap. Dipping annually into the savings reduces the amount of working capital should a site need a rebuild.

In past years the club has been successful with the fireworks sales. Two things about this.... We don't know how much longer fireworks sales will be legal in the county. And, this year we needed to solicit support from another service club (the Kiwanis Club) to help cover the man-hours required. Club member support for this type of fundraising is obviously on the decline.

I am not in favor of having a budget that exceeds the club's known annual income. I question the feasibility of attempting another year of fireworks sales base on declining member support.

My suggestion is the Club Treasurer look at ways to cut the budget and make a recommendation to the board. The Board should then make a recommendation to the membership along with a recommendation for a new dues structure.

Discussion at the Club meeting is welcomed....
