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## **President's Corner**

As the Python said, "And Now for Something Completely Different". An overdue MOU that might spell out CCARES / ARES shared use of CCARC repeaters inspired me to pondering the two clubs then discussing same with various on "both sides of the fence". Here's what I see:

- Two amateur radio clubs, one county. The clubs' charters / missions and emphases are different, to be sure. We're primarily social while "they're" (part of the problem is an "us vs. them" mentality) emergency operations.
- Perhaps a bigger difference is that (my opinion...) CCARC is more *laissez-faire* while CCARES is more controlhierarchy. The very funny Farmer's Insurance "Safe Driving Standoff" fits when you're negotiating social relationships, but not when the Cascadia Fault has just come acalling, and irreplaceable hours are ticking by.
- We use same / similar equipment (VHF/UHF & HF transceivers, antennas, local repeaters, computers, probably even

- programs...) for our respective purposes.
- And while we haven't always agreed, most of the differences driving us apart are (apparently) historical, some so far back as to almost be legendary / mythical (many I can't even get a "read" on). After a while, remembering the insult / injury / whatever becomes The Cold Dish, not unlike that of revenge and equally self- as well as other-destructive.

So KI7FXE Glenn Beach and I have started working together, to see if we can't bridge some of this unnecessary divide. We're not talking club merger, or hostile takeover either, just reaching across the gulf, making friends who are more alike us that different.

And I throw this out for both club discussion and individual, private contemplation. I suggest that this should be *easy* for us -- we're the *social* club. Would we rather have friends in CCARES, or strangers?



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## **CCARC - A Short History**

What follows is a short history of the Clallam County Amateur Radio Club (W7FEL) based upon the information found in their Silver Jubilee write-up for 1957 – 1982.

It all began (exact dates before 1954 I am unable to find) when about 18 amateur radio operators decided to get together for "rag chews, as radio operators are often known to do.

By 1954 the group had formalized, electing as president Jerry Vergeer and holding club meetings in a section of the Salmon Club Restaurant.

Unfortunately the restaurant, located on Ediz Hook, soon had to be moved because the Coast Guard needed the area for a runway. And so in 1955 the building was moved further west on Ediz Hook. The damage to the building during the move made it no longer suitable for club use.

And so began the first of many, many moves.

In 1957 the club met in a room at the YMCA. That year the members applied to the state to become incorporated. The Article of Incorporation for

Clallam County Amateur Radio Club of Port Angeles, Washington is dated January 8, 1957.

1958 was a busy year for the club. They decided to have 2 meetings per month: the first to be a business meeting and the second to be a general program meeting. The club also created the Clallam County Amateur Radio Emergency Corp. with twice monthly check ins.

In August of 1958 the CCARC held a picnic in Lincoln Park and invited the Victoria Short Wave Club to join them. It was so successful that it was suggested the picnic be held every year on a reciprocal basis. The CCARC members agreed they would be happy to attend a picnic hosted by the Victoria Club. "All here anticipate meeting you all next year and renewing the friendship which amateur radio has made possible."

By 1959 the club needed more space and their meetings were moved to Gil Morrish's Radio Shop. It was suggested the club should own its transmitter and that the club should build it.

From October 1959 to 1964 there were no club minutes recorded.



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1964 found the club meeting at Gil Morrish's TV Repair Shop on Lincoln. October 1, 1964 the club sent a letter to the ARRL concerning affiliation. At one of the quarterly Board of Directors meetings it was decided the Trustee would be the legal representative of the club.

By this time a loose group of 18 had expanded to a formalized group with 33 members – and they were keeping busy!

1965 was another very busy year for club members, starting with another move, first to the Port Angeles Police Department Pistol Range and then to the Gales Addition Fire Department. The club also opened a checking account at Olympic State Bank to pay club expenses. That same year the CCARC hosted the Victoria Club to another picnic – this time at the Fairview Grange picnic grounds. Thirty two came from Victoria with a total present of 75. The club also conducted a class in radio theory for Boy Scouts with high school boys also welcome, held a club banquet, scored 3906 points at Field Day and taught an electronic night class on a basic college level. And...again the club moved its meeting

place, this time settling at Bill and Doris Dawsons'.
