#### **LOADS OF INTRUDERS ON 10 METERS**

Pirate operations are showing up on 10 meters. Following the improvement in propagation on 10 meters in recent weeks, there are many illegal users of this band. Signals mainly seem to come from the western part of Russia.

Information regarding these intrusions is being gathered by RSGB Intruder Watch program. It will be used to support a complaint to the Russian authorities in an attempt to clear this nuisance from what should be an exclusive amateur band.

But all of the intruders may not be Russians. Others are obvious unlicensed operators using A-M and SSB in North America. These are likely illegal 11 meter export type CB sets sold by unscrupulous dealers in the United States and elsewhere that only require a tweek to put them onto the 10 meter band. If you hear these operators and have a way to record them, do so and then send the audio file to the FCC Enforcement with a letter stating what you heard, when. Be specific. The more information that you can provide to the FCC, the better. Submitted by David - KE7TTT

Web site Administrator: Absent.


**Old Business**: None

ARRL 10 Meter Contest Sets Record From The ARRL Letter for January 5, 2012

As of January 5, almost 5200 logs have been received for the ARRL 10 Meter Contest. Contest Manager Sean Kutzko, KX9X, is happy to have sunspots back: "This just goes to show what sunspots can do for activity. When the solar flux climbed to 190 in September, it was like the first warm day after a long winter; people came out to play -- and play they did, in unprecedented numbers! Activity during this contest season has been nothing short of tremendous, and it seems to have reached a zenith for the ARRL 10 Meter Contest. Old Timers and new licensees from all around the world got on the air and had one heck of a good time on 28 MHz the second weekend in December, shattering the participation record by more than 2300 logs. And we still have a week to go before the log submission deadline!""

#### Beware: The little yellow wire.

I was shocked. The small jumper didn't measure zero ohms. I checked another and it didn't either. The yellow one, the red one, the black one, they all were erratic. Sometimes they did read zero. If I held the alligator clip or wire and pushed or pulled it just right then it would be zero. What's going on here? These are the small 12 – 14 inch jumper wires with a clip on each end and vinyl covered boots. Test leads should be zero ohms. Nine jumpers and they all are erratic. No way. It must be my meter. So I get a new meter, and have the same results.

I had been working on a small project. A control board would operate a small automotive relay. It was supposed to be a simple and quick project. The board required nine volts and the relay was twelve so I built a small circuit to regulate twelve down to nine to operate the board. The board then did its tricks and was supposed to energize the automotive relay. This circuit had to work reliably but it was very erratic on the test bench. No consistent results. That's what leads me to check the jumpers.

Looking close at the jumpers I saw they were made in Japan. It seems like everything similar to this is made in China these days. That means these jumpers were old. They looked close to new. I probably got these at a garage or SK sale. To be fair to Radio Shack this was not their fault. The new ones check out fine.

Now I can go back and finish the circuit.


