



How I became interested in Ham Radio

I first became interested in Amateur Radio when I was a girl. I read two books written by Amelia Lobsenz, *Kay Everett Calls CQ*, published in 1951, and *Kay Everett Works DX*, published in 1952.





I read these books in the late 1950's, and this was the first time I became aware that GIRLS could be amateur radio operators! I pondered this for several years, but other things took precedence in my life, and I put off the ham stuff. I knew that studying the electronic theory would be hard for me.

In 1969, I was introduced to the idea again by my boyfriend, Tom Mitchell, while we were students at Seattle University. He was showing me the audio amplifier he had built with a CK-722 transistor. I asked how he had managed to paint those delicate little colored lines on the resistor! He was very patient with me, and explained that the resistor came that way. Shortly after we were married in 1970, we looked together into getting our ham licenses. We contacted the Seattle University Amateur Radio Club (WA7AKK), and were taught the skills by Mark Avakian (who is now N7MA). I was right that the electronic theory was very hard, but the required code, at least, was not much problem. It was just like a foreign language, and languages were much easier for me than the science was. I have never understood all the people who breezed right through the theory, but had trouble with the code. It was always exactly the opposite with me.

One day, Mark took Tom and me up to the Club's shack (the top floor of Campion Tower on the campus), for some practice. After sending us some code to copy, he had us each read it back to him, and told us we had passed! He decided that it would be less stressful if we thought we were only practicing instead of being tested, I guess.

Tom and I then took the written exam, passed the test, and were granted our Novice licenses in 1971. Tom went on in the next few years to get his General, Advanced, and Extra class licenses. I was content to remain a Novice. Of course, the Novice license expired after a couple of years in those days, and was not renewable, so I had to retake the exam years later, in 1987. By then the license was renewable, so I remained a Novice for 23 years. I liked being a Novice; it was a very historic title, but I realized that a Novice license was pretty much outdated, so I went ahead and got my Technician license in 2010.

There is no cost for the class, which is presented by volunteers from Clallam County Amateur Radio Club. Candidates must purchase an American Radio Relay League Technician or

General License Manual at a cost of \$29.95. Direct at http://www.arrl.org/catalog/ These manuals are also available from Dennis Tilton, who may be reached at 360-452-1217. (Save on shipping costs.)

The exam session cost is \$15.00 for processing.

Those earning their license will be allowed to communicate with other hams world wide, and to participate in the Amateur Radio Emergency Service, an important part of Homeland Security.



Solar activity is picking up!

A coronal mass ejection CME collided with Earth's magnetic field a little after 10 AM ET on January 24, 2012. The influx of particles from the CME amplified the solar radiation storm such that it is now considered the largest since October 2003. NOAA's Space Weather Prediction Center has categorized it as a "strong" -or S3 (with S5 being the highest) – storm. Solar radiation storms can affect satellite operations and short wave radio propagation. but cannot harm humans on Earth. Auroras may well be visible tonight at higher latitudes such as Michigan and Maine in the U.S., and perhaps even lower. http://www.nasa.gov/ mission pages/sunearth/news/News012312-M8.7.html
