A Voltage Regulator to run your HT from a Car Battery Paul Honore' W6IAM

Ever been caught in a situation when you needed your HT but the battery was low and no backup? Well, as long as you can operate from the immediate vicinity of your car, you have an unlimited supply of power and, with a small magmount whip antenna using the car top as a ground-plane, you can achieve up to 7.5 watts of effective radiated power from your HT. Nice in an emergency!



Most HT manufacturers offer an adapter/regulator

that plugs into your car's cigarette lighter. Trouble is, many cars weren't designed to accept plug in-adapters. No problem, you can build a simple regulator that can be mounted wherever you choose. In my case, since we're a no smoking family, in place of the cigarette lighter and ashtray that pop out of the dashboard with a touch of a finger, making for a neat, invisible installation.

The circuit consists of a three-terminal regulator, LM317 (Radio Shack part 276-1778) and a handful of external parts. It cost about ten dollars and took less time to assemble than it took to remove the ashtray from the car and re-install it.

The LM317 can dissipate 15 Watts of power but it needs a small heat sink if you plan to transmit for any length of time. The basic schematic is supplied on the data sheet for the regulator. I didn't have either a 240 ohm resistor or a 5K potentiometer so I substituted two 120 ohm resistors in series and found a 10K potentiometer works just fine. My Yaesu FT-270 HT likes to run at about 8 volts so That's what I set the regulator to deliver. Be sure to include an isolation diode at the output to prevent any circuits in your car from trying to run on your HT battery.





The whole thing can be built in a 2 inch cube that will fit nicely into the ashtray space. I used a connector from my junk box for the HT power cable. It's housed in the hole that used to be occupied by the cigarette lighter. At the HT end of the cable, is a 4mm power plug (Radio Shack 246-1778) This is probably standard but be sure to check the size on your HT. All standard size power plugs are available from .Radio Shack. Here's the circuit, assembled on an aluminum angle bracket, ready for installation into the ash tray compartment.

There you have it. With a few parts and a couple of hours work, you can be prepared for any mobile communications emergency and you don't have to worry about running down your HT

battery with overuse.



AMATEUR RADIO IN CHINA

Today, there are fewer than 20,000 licensed radio amateur operators in mainland China. Although the political and commercial atmosphere has changed, the fifty-year lapse in amateur radio activity is difficult to overcome. Many influential people in China are encouraging the development of amateur radio due to emergency communication needs and commercial development in electronics. These are leading to more applicants successfully achieving a license. There are two important radio organizations in China.

The older Chinese Radio Sports Association (CRSA) oversaw the operation of amateur radio from 1958 until 2009. A new organization, Radio Association of China (RAC) was born in 2009 and now oversees the expansion of amateur radio. The CRSA operated the first club station, BY1PK beginning in 1958. The CRSA is one of 29 member societies in IARU Region 3, which includes ARRL and the United Kingdom as well due to possessions in Oceania. Region 3 includes Asia and Oceania. Radio organizations in China are concentrating their energy on improving the licensing system so that newcomers, all over the country, are able to seek their ham license. The next major emphasis is linking traditional amateur radio, i.e. DX, contesting, and CW with contemporary internet, networking, and miniature radio design.

Vanity Call Sign Fee to Increase

On August 3, the FCC announced that the cost for an Amateur Radio Vanity Call Sign would increase.... Start saving your money now because the increase is \$0.80 to make it an even \$15. HAM Elected Prime Minister of Serbia

FCC Denies Petition Seeking to Designate Emergency Calling Frequency

Saying that it believes that the Amateur Service "allows flexibility to provide emergency communications in a way that takes into account channel availability and other local conditions," the FCC denied a Petition for Rulemaking to create a nationwide emergency calling frequency. The Petition -- filed by Bryan Boyle, WBOYLE, of Morrisville, Pennsylvania, and Jim Dixon, WB6NIL, of Alhambra, California -- called upon the FCC to designate 146.550 MHz as a "non-exclusive nationwide Amateur Radio Service emergency communications channel using FM wideband modulation."
