Initial Impressions of the Baofeng UV-5R Plus Dennis Tilton, AD7TV

I just received my new Baofeng UV-5R Plus. This may be one of the best starter HT's on the market. It comes in a couple of versions. The first is the UV-5R which sells for \$43 on Amazon. The UV-5R Plus, which I have, has all the features of the basic model plus newer firmware, a slightly expanded frequency range and improved case design.

Besides transmitting on the 2m and 70 cm ham frequencies they will also transmit on the business band, FRS, GMRS, MURS et al. This does NOT mean that it is legal to transmit on those other frequencies. In my opinion it could be handy for a member of a CERT team to work the ham frequency at the same time monitor an FRS frequency etc.



I find the unit is well built, fairly easy to manually program and very easy to program from your computer using the optional programming cable (\$7 on line). Using the free software, you can put in alpha tags in place of the frequency display, up to six characters.

The receiver seems to have good sensitivity and the transmit signal quality is reported as good.

The belt clip seems very robust and is designed to not come off your belt until you squeeze the "cloths pin".

Another feature I like is that you can monitor two stations using the dual watch feature and, at the same time listen to your favorite FM station. When a signal comes in on one of the two monitored stations, it interrupts the FM broadcast so you can hear the incoming message.

The accessory sockets on the side of the unit accept a standard Kenwood speaker mic. A Chinese version will cost from about \$15 to \$25.

A Google or Bing search will bring up a ton of results. I strongly suggest you look at http://www.miklor.com/uv5r/. This site has all the latest info you will need to set up and program any unit in the series.

I am very satisfied with this little HT. Incidentally, my other HT is a Kenwood TH-F6 that I paid more than \$300 for. The Baofeng does not have all of the "bells and whistles" of the Kenwood but

with the \$300 price differential, who am I to complain. Also, if the UV-5R were dropped in the drink it would certainly be less painful.

The bottom line is that this unit is highly recommended as either a first-time purchase or a durable back up.

I'll bring it to the Wednesday meeting for 'Tire-Kicking'.



Fundraiser for Tesla Museum Succeeds



Many people know that Nikola Tesla developed the system of alternating current that drives electricity around the globe. Let alone his pioneering robotics, remote control, and logic gates, along with his patents for radio, among other inventions and improvements during his lifetime

Recently, a viral fundraising campaign assisted by a popular blog **TheOatmeal.com** (of Seattle) to save the property of Tesla's original lab Wardenclyffe in New York, and turn it into a museum, currently there is no Tesla museum in the United States

The campaign raised \$1,370,461 from 29,000 contributors, enough to purchase the property—although not enough to properly convert the site to a museum to honor this genius.

FCC Seeks Comments on Proposed Changes to Amateur Licensing Rules, Emission Types

Earlier this month, the FCC released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) -- WT Docket No. 12-283 -- proposing to amend the Part 97



rules governing the Amateur Radio Service.

On October 24, a summary of the NPRM was published in the Federal Register and the FCC is seeking comments on it.

Specifically, the Commission is proposing to modify the Amateur Radio Service rules to grant examination credit for expired and beyond-the-grace-period-for-renewal Amateur Radio operator licenses; to shorten the grace period during which an expired amateur license may be renewed; to revise the time a call sign is not available to the vanity call sign system correspondingly, and to reduce the number of volunteer examiners needed to administer an amateur license examination. The NPRM also asks for comment on amending the rules to permit remote test administration, and proposes to amend the Amateur Radio Service rules to allow amateur stations to transmit certain additional emission types. Comments must be filed on or before December 24, 2012 (60 days after publication in the Federal Register); reply comments must be filed on or before January 22, 2013 (90 days after publication in the Federal Register). Instructions on how to file comments are listed beginning on page 12 of the NPRM.
