

Buy American or Chinese? Your decision

I've spent much of my adult life bashing Chinese fabricated products, justifiably so as many were indeed Chinese junk – and I don't mean the funny looking boat with venetian blind sails and a rudder steered with a rope. Well, I ain't gonna do it no more! Let me explain. Several years ago, I purchased two Sangean radios. They have a couple of design shortcomings, namely push button on-off switches that don't work very well and a lack of battery memory backup which necessitates reprogramming every time the power fails. Other than that, the radios perform head and antlers beyond anything comparable. Why? Well, as I discovered, there are two grades of Chinese equipment. Terrible and superb. The terrible stuff falls exclusively into the category of products that are fabricated to someone else's specifications and sold under various consumer brand names. These products meet the minimum requirements to satisfy a consumer market that is accustomed to things that wear out rapidly and can be replaced cheaply. At the other end of the spectrum are superb products that are designed by Chinese engineers and built to exacting specifications. They are reliable, they perform well, and they last, Which nudges me toward the point. Bear with me.

Soon after I began experimenting with electronics, I found an oscilloscope to be indispensable. I saved up my pennies and purchased an affordable but not very accurate oscilloscope kit. It worked well enough at audio frequencies and served within its limitations. Eventually, I got a job as a professional electronics technician and with it, my first exposure to a state of the art oscilloscope - Tektronics - which was, more than 60 years go and still is – the gold standard instrument with a price to match. I was hooked. It was no contest. Someday I *must* have a Tektronics of my own. I saved my dollars and purchased a used Tektronics. It was only a few killoHerz better than audio but it served me well for a long time. Eventually it wore out and I thought I'd never be able to afford a replacement. I was wrong.

I saved up my quarters and purchased a Chinese oscilloscope. That's right, I said Chinese, a Siglent Technologies dual trace, 50mHz 'scope for a fraction of what a comparable Tektronics would cost, even a used one. It has so many features I can't begin to discuss them. And they all work! This is the last oscilloscope I hope to purchase. It will do everything I need for the present or can imagine for the future. Sorry about that, Tektronics. *Ding Hao* for the Chinese!

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


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
