This will be a light newsletter due to a lack of input from the membership.

This weekend was the annual ARRL RTTY Round Up which is the first major contest of the year. This year FT8 was an included feature. The Round Up (RU) has always included "any legal digital mode" so this year the new kid on the block was there and it seems quite a few FT8 operators participated. I decided at the last minute to do FT8, with integration into N1MM+ contest logging program. The software hooks to do it only went live about eight days ago so waiting until the last minute didn't do me any favors! I mainly did FT8 to try to understand how it would operate under contest conditions. It was very frustrating getting it up and running. I am going to reserve a final opinion on FT8 as a contesting mode. Typically using RTTY it is possible to do 40-125 contacts an hour (depending on propagation), with FT8 it looks like 20 to 60 an hour at best. We will have to wait for things to shake out.

As we go forth into 2019 board members have discussed among themselves asking volunteers for a committee or support that you please actually participate in doing what is needed, not only will this work better for the club, but it will make the load lighter, spreading the load among all the committee members.

The Pacific Northwest DX Convention is coming to Everett this year (August 9-11th). It looks like it will be a great event with some very heavy duty players in the amateur radio community giving presentations. Details on Page 3. The WWDXC is planning on selling a one day ticket (Saturday) to allow those wishing to attend programs without the weekend hotel costs.

Almost everyone who has heard about the proposed Field Day changes are on board with them, however it will not work unless a solid group of volunteers gets behind the committees.


